Papers will be judged on criteria including: originality, timeliness of topic, quality and creativity of analysis, knowledge and use of relevant law, grammar, punctuation, and citation style.

Registration forms and payment must be postmarked by December 18, 2009 at 5PM MST Papers must be submitted via email by the same deadline.

Papers must be submitted by the deadline in PDF format with <u>no information revealing</u> your identity within the document. A submission identification number will be assigned to you by the Competition Administrator. Include your name and the title of your paper in the body of the e-mail but do not include this information in the document itself.
