SECTION 4. Payment of License Fees:

- 1.) Increase the \$100,00 business license fee for major business classifications to \$150.00 for off-reservation businesses.
- 2.) Increase the \$20.00 filing fee (by Executive Resolution No. E-164-99-CR) for on-reservation businesses to annual fees of \$100.00 for major business classifications, \$50.00 for Concession Stands, \$25.00 for Peddlers, and \$50.00 for Small businesses.
- 3.) Impose a \$50.00 daily business permit to off-reservation transit businesses that sell wares on the street, and to pay the Revenue Department the sales
- 4.) Change the calendar payment schedule to an annual payment schedule. The amendment to this Ordinance shall be posted for thirty (30) days.

RESOLUTION NO. 242-07 CR Amends Ordinance No. 1

- WHEREAS, the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe of South Dakota is an unincorporated Tribe of Indians, having accepted the provisions of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984); and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe, in order to establish its tribal organization; to conserve its tribal property; to develop its common resources; and to promote the general welfare of its people, has ordained and established a Constitution and By-Laws; and
- WHEREAS, CRST Ordinance 1, Business Licensing, levies license fees upon members and non-members doing business within the exterior boundaries of the Cheyenne River Sioux Indian Reservation or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Business License fees for persons authorized to operate a business on the reservation is \$100.00 for major business classifications, \$50.00 for small business classifications and concessions, \$25.00 for peddlers; and
- WHEREAS. on August 13, 1999 the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Executive
 Committee changed the business license fee for on-reservation businesses to a one time filing fee of \$20.00; and
- WHEREAS, on April 3, 2003 the Cheyenne river Sioux Tribal Council approved of a motion to not allow any off-reservation peddlers (transit businesses) to sell their wares on the streets; and
- WHEREAS, the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Budget & Finance Committee moved to increase the license fee for major business classifications beginning January 1, 2005; and
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Council hereby approves of the following amendments to Ordinance One: SECTION 4. Payment of License Fees:
 - 1.) Increase the \$100.00 business license fee for major business classifications to \$150.00 for off-reservation businesses.
 - Increase the \$20.00 filing fee (by Executive Resolution No. E-164-99-CR) for on-reservation businesses to annual fees of \$100.00 for major business classifications, \$50.00 for Concession Stands, \$25.00 for Peddlers, and \$50.00 for Small businesses.
 - Impose a \$50.00 daily business permit to off-reservation transit businesses
 that sell wares on the street, and to pay the Revenue Department the sales
 tax.
 - 4.) Change the calendar payment schedule to an annual payment schedule.

ORDINANCE NO. 1

(As amended August 7, 1996)

BUSINESS LICENSE ORDINANCE OF THE CHEYENNE RIVER SIOUX TRIBE

SECTION 1. Findings and Declarations of Policy. The Cheyenne River Sloux Tribe hereby finds and declares as follows:

- (a) Numerous tribal members, non-member Indians, and non-Indians are doing business with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe or its members on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation.
- (b) This business activity has a direct effect on the political integrity and the economic security of the Tribe.
- (c) The Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe retains the inherent, sovereign power to regulate, through taxes, licensing and other means, the business activities of members and non-members who transact business or the Reservation or who enter consensual business relationships with the Tribe.
- . (d) This Ordinance levies license fees upon members and non-members doing business within the exterior boundaries of the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation, as defined in the Act of March 2, 1889 (25 Stat. 888), or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, an unincorporated Tribe of Indians having accepted the provisions of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
- SECTION 2. <u>Definition of Terms</u>. The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Ordinance, have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:
- (a) "Agricultural Activity" includes the provision of fertilizing, spraying, cultivating, harvesting, processing, packing, and manufacturing services or products by professional or custom processors, manufacturers, or suppliers of agricultural products, supplies, or services; the term also includes the producing, raising or growing, and harvesting of food or fiber upon agricultural land, excluding livestock, dairy products, and crops.
- (b) "Business" includes any activity engaged in by any person, firm, company, or caused to be engaged in with the object of gain, benefit, or advantage, either direct or indirect; the term "business" shall not include law firms or professional attorneys who are licensed to practice in the state and federal courts and who have paid an admission fee to practice in the Courts of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe; the term "business" shall not be construed to include the individual employees of a business.

- (c) "Business License" means a license to operate a business on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, issued by the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Revenue Department after payment of required fee; this term is synonymous with business permit.
- (d) "Cheyenne River Indian Reservation" includes all lands within the exterior boundaries of the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation established by the Act of March 2, 1889 (25 Stat. 888), including fee patent lands, roads, water and lands used for U.S. Government purposes.
- (e) "Concessions Stand" means a temporary structure at which are sold foodstuffs, souvenirs, programs, or other goods, at rodeos, athletic events, dances, celebrations or other events.
 - (f) "Council" means the governing body of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.
- (g) "Employee" means an individual who is hired to render service other than in the pursuit of an independent calling.
- (h) "Member" means any individual who is an enrolled member of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.
 - (i) "Non-member" means any person other than a member.
- (j) "Peddler" includes any individual who travels about with wares for sale, along the streets or from door to door.
- (k) "Person" includes any individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation, municipal corporation, state, trust, business receiver, or any group or combination acting as a unit and the plural as well as the singular in number.
- (I) "Revenue Department" means the Revenue Department of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.
 - (m) "Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.
 - (n) "Tribe" means the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.

SECTION 3. License Application. Any person who wishes to engage in, pursue or transact any business within the exterior boundaries of the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe shall make application for the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal business license and present the application to the Cheyenne River Sloux Tribal Revenue Department for approval or otherwise.

SECTION 4. Payment of License Fees.

(a) License fee: Except as provided in subsections (b) through (f), below, any person authorized to operate a business on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, shall, by virtue of this Ordinance, approved by the Secretary of the Interior, pay an annual business license fee to the Revenue Department in an annual payment due on January 15 of each year or, for businesses that have not previously conducted business on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation or with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, upon the first day that such business is conducted, in the first year, and on January 15 thereafter. The full fee shall be charged for any license for any part of such period. All licensees may be required to furnish good and sufficient security; such security may be paid in cash or in the form of a bond, money order, certificate of deposit, or other like instrument. In order ess license for a business that has been granted a provisional small business licens such a business must show by evidence of Federal Income Tax return that they have ceived less than \$5,000 in gross income during the year for which they were issued the rovisional license from all endeavors on and off the Reservation or must pay the differ ice between the provisional small business license fee and the fee otherwise required for such a business, in addition to the renewal license fee before any license renew: shall be granted.

- (e) Occ signal businesses: No fee shall be imposed for a license or permit for any person or organization engaged in business on an occasional basis. For purposes of this section, the t- m "occasional basis" shall mean not more than six (6) times in one (1) year.
- (f) Charitable organizations: No fee shall be imposed for a license or permit for any organization engaged in raising funds for chantable, educational, civic or religious purposes where the receipts are not used for the personal benefit of any individual. corporation, or group or for other than such enumerated purposes.

SECTION 5. Termination of License. All licenses shall terminate at midnight on the thirty-first of December next succeeding the date of issuance.

SECTION 6. Fines. Any person subject to this Ordinance who fails to pay the license fee as required under this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of ten percent (10%) of the fee for each month the business license fee is not paid.

SECTION 7. Complying with Laws and Regulations; License Revocation. Any person properly licensed and operating a business on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation shall comply with all laws and regulations of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe and any and all prevailing federal law and regulations; any person charging excessive

rates or otherwise indulging in practices detrimental to the economic welfare of the Tribe shall have their license revoked.

SECTION 8. Remedies. Such civil remedies shall apply to and be available for the purposes of enforcing this ordinance as are appropriate; provided that, the applicable administrative requirements set forth in Section 10 have been satisfied. These remedies may include but are not limited to civil injunction of the operation of any business in violation of this ordinance and the imposition of civil fines. Such fines may by collected through the judicial attachment, levy and sale of property, or other necessary means.

SECTION 9. <u>Administration Responsibility</u>. The Revenue Department of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe is hereby charged with enforcement and administration of the provisions of this Ordinance; provided that, the authority to appoint an administrative law judge or other hearing officer empowered to make determinations as to disputed matters of fact or law shall be delegated to the Tribal Council Law and Order Committee. No person who is engaged in the performance of investigative or prosecuting functions for the Revenue Department may serve as an administrative law judge or hearing officer or otherwise advise in any decision.

SECTION 10. Administrative Hearings: Procedure.

- (a) Hearing Required: All persons against whom civil remedies or license revocations are sought or who are denied a business license or class of business license for which they have applied or who claim that they have paid for a greater fee for a business license than is required under this ordinance are entitled a hearing before the Revenue Department of the Cheyenne River Sloux Tribe.
- (b) Notice: The Revenue Director shall schedule a hearing prior to imposing civil remedies or license suspensions or at the request of any person who has been denied a business license or class of business license or who claims that they have paid for a greater fee for a business license than is required under this ordinance, and prepare a notice of hearing, including the time, place and nature of the hearing, the legal authority and justification under which the hearing is to be held and the matters of fact and law asserted. The notice of hearing shall be mailed to the affected person by registered mail not less than ten days before the hearing.
- (c) Powers of Hearing Officer: The hearing officer, at a hearing arising under this Ordinance, shall have the power to administer eaths, to subpoend and examine witnesses, and to otherwise regulate the hearing, including the admission of evidence, in accordance with tribal law and custom, inserar as such practice and procedure is compatible with the requirements of due process.
- (d) Rights of Parties: Parties shall have the right to present evidence, call and examine witnesses, and cross examine adverse witnesses. A party may be represented

by an attorney, lay advocate, or paralegal licensed to practice law in the courts of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.

- (e) Records: A tape recording or shorthand transcription shall be made of all hearings for suspension or revocation of a business license for reasons other than non-payment of a license fee or at the direction of the hearing officer. A written transcript shall be made available to any party at that party's expense,
- (f) Written Decision: All decisions of the hearing officer will be made only on the basis of the evidence on the record. Parties are entitled to written notice of decision within thirty (30) days setting forth the hearing officer's findings of fact, findings of law, decision and justification for decision.
- (g) Stay Pending Appeai: A decision of the hearing officer imposing civil fines or directing the payment of fees may be automatically stayed by posting an appeal bond with the Tribal Superior Court in the amount of the fine imposed or fee to be collected. A decision of the hearing officer suspending or revoking a business license or enjoining the operation of a business may be automatically stayed by posting a \$10,000 appeal bond with the Tribal Superior Court.
- (h) Appeal: Any party Scyr eved by the decision of the hearing officer may appeal the hearing officer's decision to the Tribal Superior Court by filling a notice of appeal, clearly stating the grounds thereof, and serving a copy of the notice of appeal on the opposing party by hand or by certhed mail within thirty days from the date of the decision. The Tribal Superior Court shall upnote the decision of the hearing officer unless it finds that the decision was arbitrary and capholous, an abuse of discretion, or not in accordance with this Ordinance or other applicable tribal or federal law. In the event that a decision imposing a civil penalty or ordering the collection of fees or penalties is overturned on appeal, the Dourt may order the Revenue Department to refund such fees or penalties. This provision aces not waive the immunity of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe or its officers from suit, except as expressiy provided herein, narrowly construed.

SECTION 11. Overpayment of License Fee. If it shall appear subsequent to the receipt of license fees or fines by the Tribe that an amount of license fee or fine has been paid that was not due under the provisions of this Ordinance, whether as a mistake of fact or law, then such amount shall be credited against any license fees due, or to become due, under this Ordinance to the person who made the overpayment, or such amount shall be refunded to such person by the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Treasurer; provided that a claim for refund shall be filed with the Revenue Department within one (1) year of collection or the overpayment of such claim shall be forever barred.

SECTION 12. <u>Disposition of Funds</u>. License fees payable under this Ordinance shall be remitted by the Revenue Department to the Treasurer with a schedule setting forth the name and residence of each applicant, the type of license issued, and the

amount paid. The Treasurer shall place such fees in a general fund account designated the Cheyenne River Business License Account. This account shall be set apart and made available for the payment of salaries, per diem, fees, expenses, and expenditures of every sort and kind whatsoever authorized to be made by the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Council, subject to the proper audit and in accordance with Sub-section i, Section 1, Article IV of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Constitution.

SECTION 13. <u>Amendments</u>. This Ordinance may be amended by the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal Council subject to approval by the Secretary of the Interior so long as required by tribal or Federal law.
