## MOTION OF THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD FOR A STAY OF ORAL ARGUMENT IN LIGHT OF UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT CESSATION

To the Honorable, the Judges of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit:

The National Labor Relations Board, by its Deputy Associate General Counsel, respectfully moves for a stay of oral argument in the above-captioned case, and shows as follows:

- 1. The Court has scheduled oral argument in this case at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 8.
- 2. A postponement of that date is necessary because the attorneys responsible for the case, along with essentially all of the Board's attorneys and other employees, have this day been furloughed indefinitely as part of a federal-government shutdown due to lack of appropriated funds. Those

attorneys are prohibited from working until they are recalled from furlough. *See* 31 U.S.C. § 1342.

- 3. The Board therefore requests a stay of oral argument until Congress has restored appropriations to the Board.
- 4. If this motion for a stay is granted, undersigned counsel will notify the Court as soon as Congress has appropriated funds for the NLRB. The Board requests that, at that point, the Court reset the argument date, with due regard to the preparation time lost during the lapse in appropriations.
- 5. Counsel for the Band has represented to counsel for the Board that the Band opposes this motion.

WHEREFORE, the Board respectfully requests that, in light of the federal-government shutdown, the Court stay oral argument in this case until Board attorneys are permitted to resume work.
