DECLARATION OF NOOKSACK TRIBAL COUNCILWOMAN MICHELLE JOAN ROBERTS

I, Michelle Joan Roberts, say:

- 1. I am an enrolled Nooksack Tribal member, a direct descendent of Annie George. I am, and I remain, an elected Nooksack Tribal Councilperson, despite Defendants illegal attempted removal of me from office yesterday. I am over eighteen years of age, I am competent to testify, and I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein.
- 2. On Thursday, January 16, 2014, the day after the Tribal Court of Appeals' ruling in the *Lomeli* case, Tribal Police Chief Rory Gilliland came to my door at home. I was not home but Chief Gilliland met my husband Rupe Roberts. Chief Gilliland had papers in his hand. Rupe told him I was not home asked him what they were. Chief Gilliland, in a good way, said, "I think we both know what they are." Rupe called me to tell me of the Police Chief's visit and I called Chief Gilliland to tell him I was out of town but that I would call him when I get back to arrange for him to come over and serve me with what I knew to be disenrollment meeting notice papers.
 - 3. It was and still is obvious that the Defendants want to carry out the disenrollment

hearings for Tribal Secretary Rudy St. Germain and me, so that they could move on with the disenrollment hearings of the rest of the Nooksack 306 without us participating as part of Tribal Council. That is exactly what they tried to accomplish in mid-August, with the two of us scheduled for the first two of over 300 hearings, before the Court of Appeals issued its stay of disenrollment. They could not be more transparent.

4. Despite my call to Chief Gilliland on the afternoon of Thursday the 16th, the Tribal Police visited my home three more times that day. The last time was around 10:00 PM. Tribal Police kept coming around for the next couple days while I was still out of town. By Saturday, January 18, 2014, I emailed Bob Kelly from my cell phone:

Bob, there has been Tribal police trying to deliver something to my house from the tribe, and have been there several times at all hours of the day and night. Why do you have them knocking at my door at ten at night? What is so urgent that you would have them basically harassing my family. I called Rory after the first time they stopped by and told him I would let him know when I was back in town to arrange for them to come over.

Bob Kelly never replied.

5. Late on the afternoon of Thursday, January 16, Bob Kelly called the first in-person Special Meeting of the Tribal Council that I can recall, or at least that I was invited to, in several months. He called it for Friday afternoon at about 3:40 PM. After lunch on Friday, January 17, at 1:21 PM, I emailed Bob:

Thank you for the invite Bob, I will be available by teleconference only, please provide me with an access code. Also, could you tell me what is on the agenda.

Thank you, Michelle

Again, Bob Kelly never replied. Tribal Council Secretary St. Germain sent a similar email to the Tribal Council, indicating he was also available for the Special Meeting that Friday afternoon via conference call. I did not see any replies to Bob Kelly from any other Councilperson. I took that to mean that we could not get quorum for the Special Meeting that day. Still, I tried calling the
