It is further ORDERED that:

- 1. A copy of this Order, together with the petition and its exhibits, shall be served upon Respondents or their counsel by personal service, by certified or registered mail return receipt requested, by overnight delivery service, or if upon counsel, electronically by email.
- 2. Proof of service completed pursuant to paragraph 1, above, shall be filed with the Clerk as soon as possible.
- 3. If Respondents have any defense to present or opposition to the petition, such defense or opposition shall be made in writing and filed with the Clerk, with copies served on counsel for the Bureau, within 21 days after Respondent has been served with this Order pursuant to paragraph 1. The Bureau may file a reply brief within 14 days after the Respondents have filed any opposition.
- 4. At the show cause hearing, only those issues brought into controversy by the responsive pleadings and factual allegations supported by affidavit will be considered. Any uncontested allegation in the petition will be considered admitted.
