DECLARATION OF GEORGE ADAMS

- I, George Adams, declare:
- 1. I am over the age of eighteen and otherwise competent to testify.
- 2. My name is George Adams.
- 3. Yálhmalh t'ówa syo7wán7 ay níchim mél7 ó7wa qeyxálhas í7lh ta-n Lhéchalosem.

 'Syélpxen' kwe-n stí7ixw-ólh sná7. Qetl'ó7sí7lhsma tolí7 Noxwkw'ól7oxwey7-ólh-chan

 just a few words in my Nooksack Language. My ancestral name is 'Syélpxen.' And that

 I am also a direct decedent from the Kendall Creek Village within the traditional

 Nooksack Territories. Furthermore, I declare that I am competent in the knowledge of our

- 4. Most all of my life, my residencies have been in Nooksack Territory located in the the Whatcom County area.
- My oral tradition teachers were my grandparents and other elders from Coast Salish (CS) tribes, i.e., Nooksack, Lummi, Tulalip, Upper Skagit, Swinomish, Saanich, Cowichen, Chilliwack, Malahat, Musqueum, Clallum tribes to name a few.
- 6. My formal education stemmed from receiving a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Education at Western Washington University in 1974. From there, I taught at both public and tribal schools and at the Nooksack after school program in grades pre-K-12, which also included adults.
- My work has been filled with great colleagues throughout the years, and more recently Mr. Allan Richardson, Anthropologist, Nooksack Place Names work (AR 2011), and Dr. Brent Galloway, Linguist, for the Nooksack dictionary (BG, GA 2013), who also did a body of work on other Central Coast Salish dialects.
- 8. I have working knowledge of the three (3) main Coast Salish (CS) dialects, including

 Lekw'éngen, Helq'eméylem and Leshútsid and I have assisted many CS tribes in language

 Curriculum. Because of my knowledge, I am respected by many native CS language

 teachers, cultural leaders and tribal leaders from the many CS tribes.
- 9. In September 2012, I was hired by the Nooksack Indian Tribe (NIT) as the Lhéchalosem Language/Culture Preservation Teacher under the Bill & Melinda Gates

 Foundation Lhéchalosem Language Grant. My name, education, credentials and experience were utilized by the NIT to obtain and implement this grant and to complete the project.

- 10. On March 12, 2014, Katherine Canete, General Manager of the Nooksack Indian Tribe
 (NIT), terminated me from my position at will as the Lhéchalosem Language/Culture
 Preservation Teacher, effective immediately.
- 11. On March 17, 2014, I submitted a written request required by the NIT Personnel Manual Policy to Suzanne Brownrigg, Human Resources Director within three (3) working days from the date I was terminated. I stated the reasons I felt the termination violated the policy.
- 12. On March 18, 2014, Donia Edwards, NIT Education Director upheld my termination. I contacted Ms. Edwards, who was my direct supervisor, to ask her if maybe the funds from the Bill & Malinda Gates Foundation ran out. She informed me the funds were still available. I do not understand why I was terminated.
- 13. I believe on or about March 19, 2014, my position was filled by Loren Roberts, who I believe lacks the minimum job qualifications of the job I was terminated from. This is a violation of the NIT's Indian Preference policy because I was removed from this position while possessing the maximum job qualifications.
- 14. On March 27, 2014, Millie A. Kennedy, who is an Attorney I sought from the Northwest Justice Project to help me in regard to my termination, contacted Suzanne Brownrigg, NIT Human Resources Director, to request the NIT Personnel Manual Policy. Ms. Brownrigg informed Ms. Kennedy that she mailed me a letter by certified mail with a return receipt on Tuesday, March 18, 2014 that included a written response to my March 17, 2014 letter. Ms. Brownrigg also informed Ms. Kennedy that I was in Stage 2 of my grievance process and that my timeframe ended on that same day. This was confusing to me given all the working days outlined in the Grievance Process.

- 15. On March 27, 2014, I was instructed by Ms. Kennedy to urgently submit to Ms.

 Brownrigg my request to convene a Grievance Review Board Hearing regarding my termination. I went to the NIT Human Resources Department to submit my request.

 Ms. Brownrigg accepted it without informing me that I had failed to meet a 5 day timeframe.
- 16. On March 31, 2014, I received a letter from Ms. Brownrigg stating that because I failed to meet the 5 day timeframe allowed to request Stage 2, my grievance was hereby considered closed.
- 17. I was removed as Lhéchalosem Language/Culture Preservation Teacher without the due process guaranteed by the NIT Constitution, the Indian Civil Rights Act, and the Personnel Manual Policy, and in violation of the Indian Preference Policy without any respect or concern for our NIT Tradition and Custom that includes oral traditions. Oral traditions allow for fairness in the dispute of resolutions with appropriate elders of our Tribe.
- 18. I do not believe I was terminated from my position under the guise of "at-will" but rather for my belief that the disenrollment of other NIT Tribal Members is unfair and for exercising my fundamental liberty right to free speech on this issue. I also believe I was terminated for exercising my right to be a candidate to run for office under Article IV of the NIT Constitution.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington that the foregoing statement is true and correct.
