FIRST BANK AND TRUST COMPANY'S RESPONSE IN OPPOSITION TO JOINT MOTION TO SUPPLEMENT THE RECORD ON APPEAL

Defendant.

First Bank and Trust Company ("First Bank"), Appellee/Counter-Appellant, hereby responds in opposition to the "Joint Motion to Supplement the Record on Appeal" filed on December 17, 2012, by the Appellants/Counter-Appellees. As outlined below, Appellants' proposed supplemental materials were not before the trial court with respect to this case, and, as such, cannot properly be incorporated into the appellate record. Sup. Ct. R. 1.33(d), 1.28(b).

During the trial court proceedings, Appellants moved jointly for summary judgment (Jt. Consol. Mot. & Br., R. 339, 341 (May 31, 2012)). First Bank, however, did not timely receive a copy of the motion or brief (Trial Tr. 115:1-6). In a belated attempt to rectify or disclaim their failure, Appellants now wish to supplement the record on appeal with three items: (1) a copy of an envelope purportedly "showing" the motion and brief were mailed to First Bank's counsel; (2) the certificates of service that were attached to the motion and to the brief; and (3) an e-mail from

Appellants' counsel to other counsel dated June 8, 2012—i.e., the day of trial—that appears to have transmitted the motion and brief as an attachment.

As for Item (2), these certificates of service already are part of the trial court record (R. 340, 354) and should not be granted special consideration to be included duplicatively. Regarding Items (1) and (3), neither of these items is part of the relevant "entire court record" as defined by Sup. Ct. R. 1.33(d). Items (1) and (3) were not before the trial court at the time of the decision being appealed and thus "are not properly part of the record on appeal." Sup. Ct. R. 1.28(b). "[T]he reviewing court is always limited to the issues actually presented below, as reflected by the record." *Frey v. Independence Fire & Cas. Co.*, 1985 OK 25, ¶ 6, 698 P.2d 17, 20; *accord U.S. ex rel. Farmers Home Admin. v. Hobbs*, 1996 OK 77, n.11, 921 P.2d 338, 341 n.11. "Only papers filed and exhibits presented to the trial court together with transcripts necessary to the appeal may be included in the record on appeal." Sup. Ct. R. 1.33(d).

Even if Items (1) and (3) were considered on appeal, they add nothing relevant, admissible, or useful to this Court's determination. First Bank's copy of Item (1), the envelope submitted as "showing" that First Bank was properly served, does not appear to bear a postmark or any legible date at all. Item (3), even if it were properly admissible, shows that at best First Bank received a copy of the motion and brief via e-mail the morning of trial, when there would have been no realistic way for First Bank to respond.

CONCLUSION

As outlined herein, the Joint Motion to Supplement the Record on Appeal should be denied.
