The motion for reconsideration of this court's January 24, 2014 order permitting this appeal to proceed is denied.

This denial is without prejudice to appellees addressing in their answering brief the issue of whether appellants are entitled to the 60-day appeal period pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2107(b) because they named federal parties in their June 3, 2013 cross-complaint.

The scope of this appeal is limited to a review of the district court's July 29, 2013 order denying a permanent injunction. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 1292(a)(1).

The opening brief was filed on March 3, 2014. The answering brief is due on June 20, 2014; and the optional reply brief is due within 14 days after service of the answering brief.
