RE: NOOKSACK POLICE CHIEF RORY
GILLILAND'S MOTION TO VACATE
ORDER DOMSESTICATING FOREIGN
JUDGMENT AND QUASH EXECUTION
AND ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS

This matter came before the Court on Ex Parte Motion of Nooksack Police Chief Rory Gilliland's motion and declaration to Stay Execution and Enforcement Efforts, pending a hearing on his Motion seeking to vacate the Court's Order domesticating the September 21, 2016 Order and Judgment of the Nooksack Tribal Court of Appeals, and to quash or bar execution and enforcement efforts by Petitioners.

Gilliland sought ex parte relief to stay ongoing execution efforts, including but not limited to the carrying out of a Break and Enter Order entered by the Court. Gilliland proposed to deposit in the Registry of the Court the full amount of the judgment against him as security for the stay, pending further order by this Court.

1 The Court has considered the Ex Parte Motion of Gilliland and the argument of his
2 Counsel, and has determined that good cause for granting Gilliland's motion and staying
3 ongoing and further execution efforts by Petitioners, until the Court can rule on Gilliland's
4 Motion to Vacate and Quash.

5 As security for the stay, Gilliland shall immediately deposit with the Court's Registry the
6 full amount of the underlying Judgment, \$2,790.15, where it will remain pending further order of
7 the Court.

8 Based on Nooksack Police Chief Rory Gilliland's motion and declaration and pursuant to
9 CR 60(e), and CR 62(b) **It Is Ordered:**



12 1. All parties to this action shall appear before this Court at 1:30 p.m. on December 9th,
13 2016 in Dept. 1 and show cause why the relief requested in the Nooksack Police Chief Rory
14 Gilliland's attached motion and declaration should not be granted.

16 2. Copies of Nooksack Police Chief Rory Gilliland's motion to vacate the judgment,
17 supporting declaration and this order shall be personally served upon Petitioners no later than
18 Nov. 28, 2016.

21 3. All efforts to further enforce and/or execute this Court's order domesticating a foreign
22 judgment dated October 21, 2016 are hereby stayed pending disposition of Nooksack Police
23 Chief Rory Gilliland's motion to vacate the Court's Order domesticating the September 21, 2016
24 Order and Judgment of the Nooksack Tribal Court of Appeals.
