Alaska Legal Services Corporation is hiring a full-time attorney in Bethel to work in partnership with the Association of Village Council Presidents to provide legal advice and representation to YK Delta tribal governments to enhance and develop tribal justice systems handling matters related to child protection and community and family safety.

The attorney will provide legal advice to Tribes regarding jurisdiction, due process, and case handling. Duties will include assistance with notices, forms, benchbooks, hearings, court orders, and appeals. The attorney will be based at AVCP, and will work closely with ALSC's Native Law Unit supervising attorney as well as AVCP's Tribal Justice Program. The attorney will travel regularly to villages in the YK Delta.

Candidates should possess knowledge, appreciation, experience, and commitment to working with and for Alaska Native peoples and statewide Native organizations. ALSC is proud to be an equal opportunity employer.
