Join the Grand Traverse Band for a gathering to learn how to help shut down the 64-year-old Line 5 oil pipeline in the Straits of Mackinac. Line 5 moves 23 million gallons of crude oil through twin pipelines that sit on the bottom of the Great Lakes for 4.5 miles. University of Michigan scientists have called the Straits “**the worst possible place for an oil spill.**” The Grand Traverse Band’s Tribal Council passed a resolution calling on the State of Michigan to decommission Line 5 in 2015.
