The Federal Public Defender for the District of New Mexico is seeking a full time, experienced Research and Writing Attorney for the main office in Albuquerque. More than one vacancy may be filled from this announcement. The Federal Public Defender operates under authority of the Criminal Justice Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A, and provides legal representation in federal criminal cases and related matters in the federal courts.

The Research and Writing Attorney is an attorney position that provides advanced research and writing services to staff attorneys on trial and appellate cases, performs computer assisted legal research, aids in the development of legal strategies, writes briefs, motions, petitions for certiorari, and legal memoranda for review by the Defender and staff attorneys. General duties include examining, analyzing and researching records and issues, performing legal research and preparing legal documents, assisting AFD staff with all aspects of case preparation, training, continuing legal education and supervision of legal interns as appropriate. *The Research and Writing Attorney does not ordinarily sign pleadings or make court appearances*.

Minimum qualifications include graduation from an accredited law school, admission to practice in good standing before the highest court of a state, and a working knowledge of federal criminal law and procedure. Candidates must be able to analyze legal issues from lengthy, complex records, write clearly and concisely, and have strong computer automation skills. Prior appellate writing experience, law review membership or a judicial law clerkship are desirable.

This is a full-time position with federal salary and benefits based upon qualifications and experience. Starting pay ranges from a JSP 9-15, \$50,769 to \$121,690 annually depending on experience. Research and Writing Attorneys may not engage in the private practice of law. All employees are subject to mandatory electronic fund transfer (direct deposit) for payment of net pay.
