I am one of the original plaintiffs on the court case # CV 15-92-GF-BMM-JTJ.
I gave testimony on my behalf as an enrolled member of the Blackfeet Nation and confederacy known as the (Amskapii Pikunii) Southern Piegan located here in Montana of the United States of America.

When the election was held on April 20th 2017 the Blackfeet voters rights were fraudulently violated. The election committee along with the BIA certified the vote on the same day of the election.

The manner of review is our enforcement of rules regulations and laws pertaining to our constitution. These laws were not followed by the superintendent of the Blackfeet Agency (BIA) And the secretary of Interior.

Where asking that the Federal court enforce the trust responsibility of BIA according to our constitution. And that the manner of review be followed, enforcement and carried out.

Finally we as plaintiffs filed our injunction in your court to stop all illegal actions against our corporate rights and assets in October of 2015. We would like to ask the court why it took the almost 3 years to finally set a court hearing for dismissal. Our original complaint was never heard.

If we would have gotten our day in court this issue wouldn't have been where it is at today. Therefore we as enrolled members of the Blackfeet tribe ask the court to allow this case be move forward. And not be dismissed. If so we ask that it be dismissed without prejudice
