SILC students may represent individual clients or tribal groups or Indian communities. Students are taught to approach legal solutions premised on tribal sovereignty, cultural rights or traditional internal law, and general legal principles.

We value candidates from diverse backgrounds and perspectives as we work toward enriching our students' learning through inclusion and enhancing the faculty's academic mission of research, teaching, service, and community engagement in New Mexico, the United States, and the world.
