the Nooksack Tribe. To reach the Tribal Court via that driveway, you need to cross a strip of BNSF land that runs parallel to Deming Road, a state roadway. But the Nooksack Police had parked their vehicles on that BNSF land and placed the yellow traffic cones along the white traffic line running along Deming Road, preventing anybody from even stepping foot on the driveway towards the Tribal Court. That forced people like me to walk in traffic along Deming Road.

- 4. Because of the Nooksack police blockade, there was no place to park near the Tribal Court. My boyfriend dropped me off on Deming Road and went to park his vehicle. I walked westbound along Deming Road towards the Tribal Court driveway and the police blockade on BNSF land with my phone activated to record what appeared to be the Tribal police not allowing anybody into Tribal Court to support my sister.
- 5. As I approached the driveway and blockade, I calmly asked the Tribal police, "Do you know if they're having my sister's court over there?" Mr. Ashby indicated my sister Margetty had Tribal Court at 1:30 p.m. Although I never crossed the line of yellow traffic cones, Mr. Ashby began to approach me, saying, "Stay behind the line." Mr. Ashby repeated his command, raising his voice more loudly each time. I sill had not crossed the line of yellow traffic cones. Mr. Ashby then quickly approached me, coming within inches of me. Fearing he was about to put his hands on me, I yelled, "Don't touch me." I was holding my phone in my right hand. Mr. Ashby then put both of his hands on the left side of my upper body, between my collar bone and breasts, and violently shoved me. As soon as he assaulted me, I became angry and hysterical. I felt so violated. I yelled at Mr. Ashby that they were not even on "tribal property." Mr. Ashby incorrectly stated, "Yes, it is."
- 6. Attached as **Exhibit 1** is compact disc containing a two minute, eleven second video taken with my cell phone of my walk along Deming Road towards the Tribal Court

driveway and Mr. Ashby's assault of me on non-tribal of-reservation lands, on December 15,

2016. Here is a screenshot from the moment in that video of Mr. Ashby right before he

- I left the Tribal Court area and immediately called the Whatcom County Sherriff 7. to report that Mr. Ashby assaulted me. I knew Whatcom County had jurisdiction given where I was assaulted, not the Nooksack Tribe. When I got to my home, a Whatcom County Sherriff Deputy was waiting for me in my driveway. I explained to the Deputy what happened with Mr. Ashby and he transported the video of the incident from my phone to his. The Deputy left me with a Whatcom County Sherriff's Office case number. I never heard back from Whatcom County about any investigation of Mr. Ashby's assault of me on December 15, 2016.
- 8. I have spoken to Carmen Tageant about what Mr. Ashby did to her on January 5, 2018, and am struck by the similarities between his assault of her and his assault of me. He is a violent abuser of Native women and I have the video to prove it.
