Tamera is Navajo from Crownpoint, N.M. She is currently an Assistant Prosecutor for the Puyallup Tribe of Indians. Prior to that position she was an Attorney-Prosecutor for the Navajo Nation. Tamera was also a Legislative and Government Affairs Associate for the Navajo Nation Washington Office in Washington D.C. She was a legal fellow at the National Congress of American Indians, working on VAWA, Juvenile Justice, TLOA, and the ICWA. She clerked at the U.S. Attorney's Office in the District of New Mexico, the Office of Tribal Justice U.S. Department of Justice, and the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community Prosecutor's Office. Tamera graduated from Michigan State University College of Law with a J.D. and Certificate in Indigenous Law and Policy, Arizona State University with a Baccalaureate in Business & Public Relations, and licensed to practice law in N.M. and the Navajo Nation.
