Cory has successfully litigated many of these issues in federal court and has represented Indian Tribes and Nations in the Courts of Appeals for the Ninth, Second, and Seventh Circuits. Cory is ranked nationally by Chambers U.S.A. as a Band 3 Indian law practitioner.
