

POST-GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS WITH THE NATIVE AMERICAN RIGHTS FUND

NARF invites law students beginning their third year, recent law school graduates, and those with judicial clerkships to apply for sponsorship for a post graduate fellowship. NARF does not provide fellowship funding. NARF does sponsor applicants to fellowships funded by The <u>Skadden Fellowship Foundation</u> and other fellowship programs, including fellowships offered directly by law schools. Unfortunately at this time, NARF does not sponsor students for the Equal Justice Works fellowship.

When requesting sponsorship for a fellowship, please submit the following materials:

- Resume
- Cover letter addressing your interest and experience in federal Indian law and, if a fellowship proposal is required, information describing your ideas for the proposal. Note: It is not necessary to have a fully-developed proposal at the application stage.
- Law school transcript
- Two brief legal writing samples
- Contact information for three (3) references, two of whom must be academic or professional.

For applicants seeking NARF's sponsorship for the Skadden Fellowship, please submit the application materials listed above to Kevin Cheng no later than Monday, June 29, 2020.

For other fellowship opportunities, please submit these materials **no later than eight** (8) weeks before the fellowship deadline or sooner. While applications received less than eight weeks in advance of the fellowship organization's application deadline will be considered, late requests for sponsorship are strongly discouraged and may have a negative impact on the consideration of a request for sponsorship from NARF.
