State present. Defendant in custody and represented by Attorney Luber. Court hears allocution and enters the following order:

Court accepts plea unconditionally in 71D03-1310-FB-000147 and 71D03-1811-F4-000077.

In 71D03-1310-FB-000147, on the Defendant's probation violation, the Court now revokes probation and orders the Defendant to serve four years incarceration in the Department of Correction. Defendant has zero credit time in this case.

In 71D03-1811-F4-000077, on the Defendant's plea to Count II, Burglary, Level 5 felony, the Court enters judgment of conviction. Count I dismissed. Court sentences the Defendant to five years incarceration. Defendant has 70 days of Class B credit time. Court finds the Defendant indigent as to court costs.

Defendant has a history of substance abuse and chemical addiction and dependency, and appears to be an appropriate candidate for the DOC's Recovery While Incarcerated. Court recommends the Defendant be evaluated for and considered for Recovery While Incarcerated and mental health treatment. Upon successful completion of the clinically appropriate substance abuse treatment program as determined by IDOC, the Court will consider a modification to this sentence after the Defendant has served four years in the Department of Correction.

Sentences in 71D03-1310-FB-000147 and 71D03-1811-F4-000077 are consecutive.

In 71D03-1902-F6-000113, on the return of the jury verdict of guilty of Count I, Unlawful Possession of a Syringe, Level 6 felony, the Court enters judgment of conviction. Court sentences the Defendant to 464 days incarceration. Defendant has 232 days of Class 1 credit which satisfies this sentence. This sentence is completed.

Defendant advised of appeal rights. Appearance of Attorney Luber continued in this case to discuss if the Defendant wishes to appeal and to file Notice of Appeal. Court finds the Defendant indigent.
