INTRODUCTION

The intent of this publication is to provide a readily accessible means of identifying waterbodies that are open to *Tribal Alternative Monitoring of Open-Water Spearing in the Wisconsin Portion of the 1837 and 1842 Ceded Territories* applicable to the Voigt Treaty Off-Reservation Conservation Code.

The contents of this publication will be modified annually. Please contact the Biological Services Division or the Division of Intergovernmental Affairs of the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission to confirm the most recent update or see the GLIFWC website at http://www.glifwc.org.

REGULATIONS

In the areas designated as open for the alternative monitoring of open-water spearing within the portion of the Ceded Territories located in the State of Wisconsin, no member shall harvest walleye in the spring by the method of open-water spearing, without a monitoring team present, unless that waterbody is designated as an alternatively monitored waterbody for that night, and the member(s) maintain compliance with the procedures listed in this document and Chapter 9 of the applicable Off-Reservation Code. In regard to any permit issued, a member must comply with all regulations established in Chapter 9 of the applicable Off-Reservation Conservation Code and must also comply with all other terms and conditions of the permit as imposed by the Tribe.

No member shall harvest walleye by the method of open-water spearing, without a monitoring team present, on any waterbody except those listed in this document and in accordance with the following regulations:

- (a) The tribes shall recommend that tribal prosecutors charge in such a way so that tribal members caught in violation of this provision receive a minimum of a one-year revocation of their treaty reserved harvesting rights upon successful prosecution.
- (b) Any tribe seeking to designate, for open-water spearing, a waterbody listed in this document, as an alternatively monitored waterbody, the Tribal Conservation Department, or designee, shall provide notice to the DNR the name of the waterbody listed in this document for which tribes have designated for open-water spearing that night, and of the walleye bag limit for each waterbody to be fished, in accordance with Sec. 5.00 of the Voigt Intertribal Task Force Protocol on Walleye and Muskellunge Harvest Levels.

(In the event that a tribe has designated a waterbody for alternative monitoring and issues no open-water spearing permits for that night, the tribal conservation department, or its designee, shall provide notice to the DNR by 6:00 p.m. that day, in accordance with sec. 5.10 of the Voigt Intertribal Task Force Protocol on Walleye and Muskellunge Harvest Levels.)

- (c) Each Tribe may only designate for alternative monitoring, two (2) waterbodies per night that are listed in this document. However after appropriate data, information and study on the compliance and enforcement of this stipulation, and upon consultation with and approval of the State, the Tribes may incrementally increase the number of waterbodies designated for alternative monitoring per night, by each tribe, to ten (10) waterbodies that are listed in this document.
- (d) This document may only initially include lakes that possess a maximum safe harvest of eighty (80) walleye and eight (8)

muskellunge. After reviewing appropriate data and information and studying the compliance and enforcement of this stipulation, and upon further written agreement of the parties, the tribes may incrementally increase the list of water bodies to eventually include lakes that possess a maximum safe harvest of two hundred (200) walleye.

- (e) Any Tribe seeking to designate for spring spearing a waterbody listed in this document shall designate a creel team to be present at a specific location, or at the tribal registration station, provided:
 - (i) The specific location of the creel team shall be determined and communicated to the permittee at the time the permit is issued.
 - (ii) The creel team shall remain on duty at the specified location until the alternatively monitored permit(s) that the creel team is responsible for is turned in and the fish harvested are creeled, or notice is provided by the Biological Services Division or Conservation Enforcement Division that the creel team is released for the night.
- (f) A tribal member may only be issued for that night, an alternatively monitored permit for open-water spearing on a waterbody listed in this document, <u>before</u> the tribal member is issued a spring spearing permit monitored on-site (at the landing) or netting permit(s) for that night, except that a member may be issued a netting permit to allow for setting of nets only. Once a tribal member has been issued an open-water spearing permit monitored on-site (at the landing), that member may not receive, for that same night, an alternative monitoring permit for open-water spearing. Likewise, a tribal member may not receive an alternative monitoring permit for open-water spearing for that night if that member will be required to lift nets that night, pursuant to an active netting permit. At any one time a tribal member may only possess one (1) alternative monitoring permit for a waterbody listed in this document.
 - (i) For the purpose of this section "night" shall be defined as the time between one hour after sunset on one day, and one hour before sunrise on the following day; and the time of sunset and sunrise shall be ascertained according to the mean solar time of the ninetieth meridian west from Greenwich, commonly known as central time, as given in any almanac.
- (g) Originally, tribes were limited to only harvesting walleye pursuant to the regulations established for alternative monitoring. The parties agree that it is appropriate to allow tribes to harvest muskellunge and other fish pursuant to these regulations. The parties agree that tribes may include waterbodies that possess a maximum safe harvest of eight (8) muskellunge as available for

alternative monitoring and within the administrative document Tribal Alternative Monitoring of Open-Water Spearing on Certain Lakes in the Wisconsin Portion of the 1837 and 1842 Ceded Territories.

VOIGT INTERTRIBAL TASK FORCE PROTOCOL ON MANOOMINIKEWIN (WILD RICE HARVEST) LEVELS

Pursuant to and as an implementation of the *Chippewa Intertribal Agreement Governing* the Resource Management and Regulation of Off-Reservation Treaty Rights in the Ceded Territory, and as an implementation of the stipulation reached between the tribal and state parties in Lac Courte Oreilles, et. al. v. State of Wisconsin regarding wild rice issues, the Voigt Intertribal Task Force Committee (hereinafter termed "Task Force") of the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission (hereinafter termed "GLIFWC") hereby adopts and enacts the following system for wild rice management and regulation:

- 1. **Biological Services Designation of Wild Rice Waters Available for Harvest**. The Task Force hereby authorizes and designates the Biological Services Division (hereinafter termed "BSD") of GLIFWC to provide to the several Bands, no later than July 15 of each year, the list of waters with harvestable wild rice beds in the ceded territory. The BSD shall also provide an estimate of the number of pounds of wild rice harvested in the ceded territory by the several Bands in the previous year and an estimate, if available, of the potential yield of wild rice (in pounds) for each of the waters listed.
- 2. **Waters Subject to Opening through Tribal Ricing Authority**. The following lakes shall be subject to opening by the Tribal Wild Rice Authority for each specified Tribe:
 - a. **Barron County**:

Bear, Beaver, Dam, Red Cedar. St. Croix

b. **Bayfield County**:

Totogatic. Lac Courte Oreilles

c. Burnett County:

Bashaw, Big Clam, Big Sand, St. Croix Briggs, Gaslyn, Long, Mud (Town of Oakland), Mud (Town of Swiss), Mud Hen, Spencer, Trade.

d. **Douglas County**:

1. Allouez Bay. St Croix

2. Mulligan. Lac Courte Oreilles

e. Forest County:

Atkins, Riley, Big Rice, Wabigon. Mole Lake

f. **Oneida County**:

1. Big, Big Lake, Thoroughfare, Lac du Flambeau

Gary, Little Rice, Rice.

2. Spur. Mole Lake

g. **Polk County**:

Balsam Branch, Big Round, East, St. Croix Glenton, Little Butternut, Nye,

Rice, White Ash

h. Vilas County:

Allequash, Little Rice, Nixon, Lac du Flambeau Irving, Aurora, West Plum, Devine, West Ellerson, Michey Mud, Frost, Rice, Sand.

i. Washburn County:

1. Bear, Gilmore, Little Mud, Long, St. Croix Mud, Nancy, Spring

2. Rice (Smith's Bridge), Tranus Lac Courte Oreilles

- 3. **Additional Waters**. Upon the Recommendation of the Biological Services Division of GLIFWC that additional waters require management through the imposition of a closure provision, or through enhancement effort protection, the Task Force shall identify a Tribal Wild Rice Authority for each additional body of water.
- 4. **Tribal Notification to BSD**. The Tribes will notify the BSD immediately after the Tribe's Wild Rice Authority posts notice when a body of water will be open or closed for wild rice harvesting. The BSD immediately shall notify the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources when a Tribe's Wild Rice Authority has opened or closed a body of water for wild rice harvesting.
- 5. **Repeal of Previous Protocols**. The Task Force Protocol on Wild Rice Harvest Levels dated July 3, 1991, is hereby rescinded and replaced by this protocol.




This administrative document is referred to in subsection 3.27(1)(d) of the Off Reservation Conservation Code (applicable to the Wisconsin portion of the 1837 and 1842 Ceded Territories). The Tribal Wildlife Management Units map for Wisconsin (second map) describes the management units pertaining to tribal deer, bear, fisher, otter, bobcat and wild turkey harvest pursuant to Chapters 6, 7 and 8 of the Model Off Reservation Conservation Code. The Tribal Elk Management Units (fourth map) describes the management units in Wisconsin pertaining to tribal elk harvest pursuant to Chapter 15 of the Off Reservation Conservation Code.

This administrative document is referred to in Sec. 3.34 of the Model Off Reservation Conservation Code for the 1837 Minnesota Ceded Territory. The Tribal Wildlife Units map for Minnesota (third map) describes the management units pertaining to tribal deer, bear, fisher, otter, bobcat, wild turkey and marten harvest pursuant to Chapters 6, 7 and 8 of the Off Reservation Conservation for the 1837 Minnesota Ceded Territory.

VOIGT INTERTRIBAL TASK FORCE PROTOCOL NOODAMASHKOOZWE (ELK HARVEST)

Pursuant to and as an implementation of the <u>Chippewa Intertribal Agreement Governing the Resource Management and Regulation of Off-Reservation Treaty Rights in the Ceded Territory</u>, the Voigt Intertribal Task Force Committee (hereinafter termed "Task Force") of the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission (hereinafter termed "GLIFWC") hereby adopts and enacts the following system for elk management and regulations:

- 1. <u>Biological Services Designation of Harvest Quotas</u>. The Task Force hereby authorizes and designates the Biological Services Division (hereinafter termed BSD) of GLIFWC to provide to the several bands, no later than at the May meeting of the Task Force, the total number of elk available for harvest in the ceded territory. The number shall be based upon the joint assessment of the BSD and the Department of Natural Resources to provide for annual elk harvesting consistent with elk population goals.
- **2.** <u>Task Force Determination of Harvest Levels</u>. The Task Force shall establish the Bands' elk harvest quotas for the coming elk hunting season at the June meeting of the Task Force, in consultation with the BSD. The total number of elk to be subject to tribal harvest shall not exceed the number available determined by the joint assessment.
- **3.** Task Force Final Declaration of Elk Harvest Quotas and Elk Seasons. At the conclusion of their meeting(s), but in no event later than June 15, the Task Force shall file and publish its Final Declaration of Elk Harvest Quotas for the upcoming elk season. The Declaration shall be certified by the BSD Wildlife Section Leader and the Director of the BSD as in compliance with any management plan for elk which may have been previously approved by the Task Force and its member tribes.
- **4.** <u>Effect of Final Declaration</u>. The Final Declaration shall conclusively establish the number of elk subject to tribal harvest in the ceded territory during the upcoming elk season, and shall be immediately transmitted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources by the BSD for its use in permitting elk harvest by State-licensed hunters.
- **5.** <u>Methods for Determining Number of Antlerless Elk Permits or Bull Elk Permits Which may be Issued.</u> The number of antlerless elk permits and bull elk permits, which may be issued at any one time for an elk management zone during the time period for which an antlerless elk permit or bull elk permit is valid shall be determined in accordance with the provisions set forth below.
- **5.01.** (a) For the purpose of this protocol, the "remaining antlerless elk harvest" for any management zone means the tribal quota for that zone minus the sum of the antlerless elk harvest in that zone.
 - (b) For the purpose of this protocol, the "remaining bull elk harvest" for any

Local sunrise and sunset times can be determined using apps such as *WEATHERBUG* or *SUN SURVEYOR LITE* on a mobile device, or websites such as <u>google.com</u> or <u>sunrise-sunset.org</u>. Hunting hours for migratory birds are published annually in the federal register, and posted on GLIFWC's website (<u>glifwc.org</u>).

management zone means the tribal quota for that zone minus the sum of the bull elk harvest in that zone.

- **5.02.** The number of antlerless elk permits and bull elk permits which may be issued for elk shall be determined in accordance with the following formula:
 - (a) Number of Antlerless Elk Permits = Remaining Antlerless Elk Harvest
 Hunter Success Rate
 - (a) Number of Bull Elk Permits = Remaining Bull Elk Harvest
 Hunter Success Rate
- **5.03.** The hunter success rate for a management zone shall be the success rate average from the most recent three (3) previous seasons or an average of fewer seasons when a three (3) year average is not available. For a zone without an adequate history of hunter success, the average success rates shall be one hundred percent (100%). The BSD is authorized to determine the hunter success rate for any elk management zone.
- **5.04.** When the several Bands otherwise fail to agree, the Director of the BSD, or his or her designate, shall be authorized to calculate the number of antlerless elk permits and bull elk permits available for issuance in that zone by each Band so as to ensure that the total number of antlerless elk permits and bull elk permits issued by all Bands does not exceed the maximum number which may be issued for that zone.
