

AVCP: Associate General Counsel

The Association of Village Council Presidents (AVCP) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit tribal consortium of fifty-six federally recognized tribes. Tucked away between two of Southwest Alaska's major rivers in an area the size of the State of New York, the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta is the traditional home of the Yup'ik, Cup'ik, and Athabascan peoples. AVCP is a fast-paced environment, where we value innovative thinking, teamwork, and our traditional Yup'ik and Cup'ik values.

The Associate General Counsel (AGC) is the primary attorney responsible for reviewing, drafting, and negotiating contracts, subawards, and other agreements for AVCP departments and divisions; serves on AVCP's negotiation team for federal and state compacts; and monitors compliance with contracts and other agreements. The AGC will also participate in legal advocacy initiatives typical of a tribal non-profit.

Applicants must be admitted to practice law in Alaska, or licensed in another jurisdiction and able to become admitted to practice law in Alaska within one (1) year of hire. Experience in non-profit, transactional, or Indian law preferred. Qualified applicants located, or willing to relocate, to Bethel, Alaska will be given preference.
