Position: Deputy Attorney General

Main Duties:

- Deputy Attorneys General in the Indian and Gaming Law Section handle both Indian law and gambling issues.
- Deputies advise and represent the State and the Governor in negotiation, interpretation, enforcement, and litigation in state and federal court concerning tribal gaming compacts.
- Deputies counsel the State and the Governor regarding various Indian law issues including environmental impacts resulting from projects occurring on tribal land.
- Deputies provide counsel to the Attorney General on Indian law and gambling issues, including unlawful gambling.
- Deputies advise and represent the Department of Justice Bureau of Gambling Control and the California Gambling Control Commission in administrative and judicial proceedings in connection with their respective compact, gambling regulatory programs, and gambling licensing programs, and the California Horse Racing Board and the California State Lottery in judicial proceedings.
- Deputies' duties also include work relating to the Major League Sporting Event Raffles Program, and actions under the Unfair Competition Law relating to unlawful gambling.

Qualifications:

- The section relies heavily on a spirit of cooperation, team effort and mutual accommodation.
- Travel within California may be required.
