Is there a registration cost to attend the Training?

No, there is no cost to you or your tribe/organization to register for the Training, but space is limited and is on a first-to-register basis. Transportation and lodging is not covered. Who should attend the Training?

Anyone who practices in tribal court and encounters domestic/family violence in their cases will benefit from the lectures, "how tos," fact pattern scenarios and hands-on workshops. Tribal court personnel, tribal departments, administrators and law enforcement interested in how tribes might implement VAWA/DV court procedures will benefit from the presentations and discussions led by working tribal court judges and other professionals.

What is the Training about?

The Training is designed to assist tribes/tribal courts in their implementation of the expanded provisions of the re-authorized Violence Against Women Act, especially in P.L. 280 jurisdictions. Day 1 of the Training will feature lectures, presentations and discussion of relevant topics; Day 2 Workshops will focus on the drafting of domestic violence codes, pleadings and documents; Day 3 will focus on preparation for a Domestic Violence-based trial.
